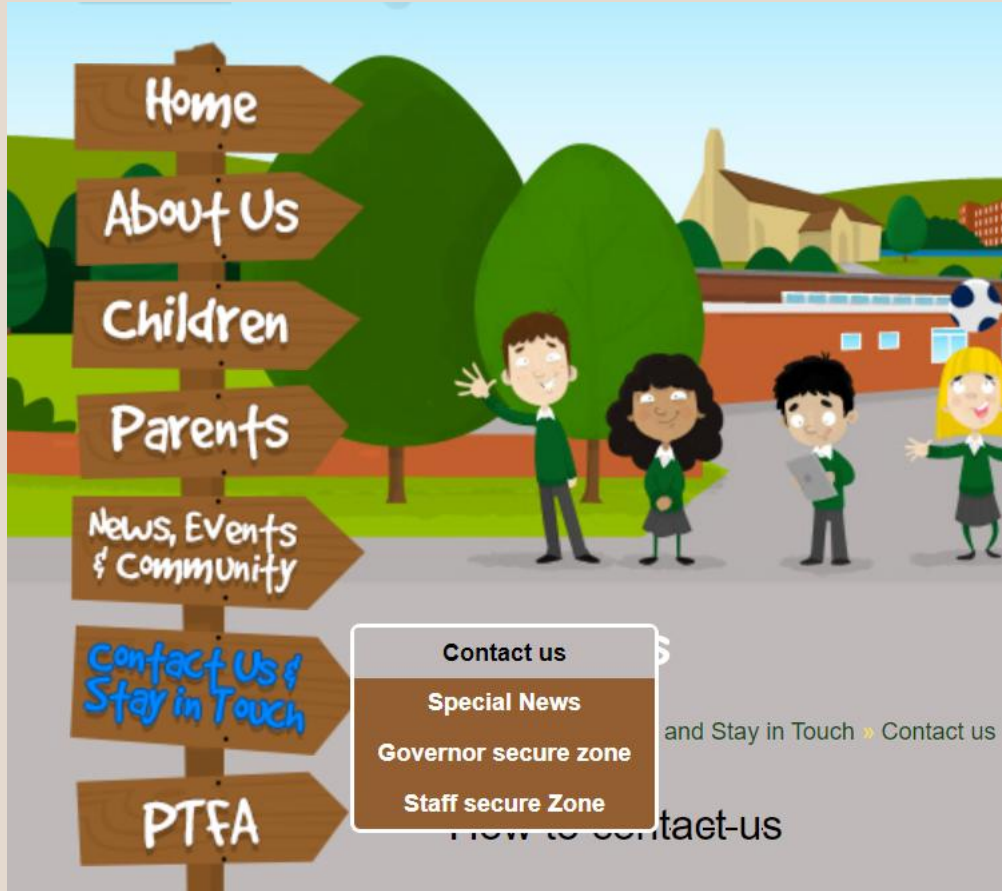

Other essential info

- PE is on Wednesday and Friday.
- Please use a bookbag not a big rucksack as there is only limited tray storage.
- Treat snacks- Monday and Friday, healthy snacks- Tuesday to Thursday (fruit is available daily)
- Children should have sports lid water bottles and not screw lids to prevent spillages.
- Uniform- please name
- PE kit- white t-shirt, shorts, joggers, sweat top, trainers- all named please

In Year 2...

Optional SATs- these will take place in May 2026. The SATs papers the government supply only help the teacher assessment judgements we make. They are not stand alone tests.

Accelerated Reader- some children will take a 'Star Test' before October half term if appropriate. This will give the child a range of book they can choose from (eg: 1.5-2.2). Children can then read a book of their choice at home with a parent/ carer twice and take a quiz in school to assess their comprehension of their reading.

Decodable books- we will continue to read these until October half term and beyond for the children for whom it is appropriate.

Share a story books- these will continue to be sent home until the children access AR books.

Make sure reading records are in school each day.
